



# Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

*What is in it for building contractors?*

The AGC [supported](#) Senate [bipartisan infrastructure bill](#) would invest more than \$1.2 trillion to build the nation’s roads, bridges, transit systems, airports, ports and waterways, drinking water and wastewater systems, energy infrastructure and more. Here is a breakdown of some of what is in it for building contractors.

<b>Energy Efficiency Revolving Loan Fund Capitalization Grant program</b> Establishes new revolving fund for states to conduct commercial or residential energy audits or upgrades and retrofits.	\$250M
<b>Grants for energy efficiency improvements and renewable energy improvements at public school facilities</b>	\$500M
<b>Cost-Effective Codes Implementation for Efficiency and Resilience</b> New competitive grant program for states or regional partnerships to implement updated building energy codes	\$225M
<b>Weatherization Assistance Program</b> Grant program to reduce residential energy usage through the installation of energy saving measures	\$3.5B
<b>Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant</b> Block grant program to provide grants to state and local governments for energy efficiency and conservation projects	\$550M
<b>Energy efficiency materials pilot program</b> Grants to non-profits to install energy-efficiency materials in their buildings	\$50M
<b>AFFECT Grants</b> Assisting Federal Facilities with Energy Conservation Technologies (AFFECT) grant program, to provide grants to federal agencies to make energy and water efficiency upgrades to federal buildings	\$250M
<b>Building, Training, and Assessment Centers</b> Grants to higher education institutions to train building technicians and engineers on implementing modern building technologies.	\$10M
<b>Career Skills Training</b> Grants for skills training program for industry-related certification to install energy efficient buildings technologies	\$10M
<b>Transportation Technology Center (TTC)</b> Authorizes the Secretary of Transportation to construct or repair buildings and/or facilities at the TTC in Pueblo, Colorado, and collect fees to carry out said construction	N/A

## *Additional Background*

### **Does Not Include the [AGC-Opposed PRO Act](#)**

Unlike other proposals that tie investment in infrastructure to passage of the PRO Act, this historic investment in our infrastructure will provide long-term certainty in the planning process for states and create good-paying construction jobs.

### **Doesn’t Increase Taxes on Construction Companies**

Unlike prior proposals, like the [American Jobs Plan](#), this does not include increases to the corporate tax rate which could have undermined the economic benefits of this investment.
