HISTORY

The area was founded in 1659 by Major John Mason, military leader of the Connecticut Colony, and the Reverend James Filch. At this time the two men were part of a group of Old Saybrook settlers who sailed up the Thames River in search of a site for a new settlement. They purchased a nine mile square plot from Chief Uncas of the Mohegans for the sum of 70 pounds and settled in the same area now known as Norwichtown.

The major occupation in the early years was farming. In 1648 the first public landing was established at the confluence of the Thames, Yantic, and Shetucket Rivers, at a spot still called Chelsea Landing. Here the industry of ship building was started for trading with the West Indies. By 1774 Norwich was the second largest in Connecticut.

The tremendous water power of the Yantic and Shetucket Rivers made Norwich an ideal area for manufacturing during the nineteenth century. Steamships and the railroad linked Norwich with the surrounding areas and allowed the industrial prosperity of the area to reach to Boston, New York, and the rest of the world.

The area continued to be a leader in commerce and industry during the Civil War and up to the stock market crash of 1929. That, and the hurricane of 1938 hit the area very hard. A shift to a regional economy became evident following World War II. Today, however, Norwich is again host to a wide variety of industries from all over the world.
