

## In July 2021, YouGov conducted polls on the popularity of adding oral health coverage to Medicare.



# The results indicate broad national support for adding an oral health benefit to Medicare. 

## 78\%

More than three-quarters of likely voters support adding oral health coverage to Medicare.


# Support for adding an oral health beneffit to Medicare is even higher in 2022 battleground states. 

## 82\%

More than eight in 10 battleground voters support adding oral health coverage to Medicare.


## Majority support for adding the benefit was found across key population segments.

54\% of voters blame government dysfunction and Congress ignoring the needs of older Americans
