Mid-century memories	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Additional details about community facilities and places of worship have been added to the history section, such as Viscount Bennett, HMCS Tecumseh and local places of worship.
Formation of the land	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Some details regarding environmental history, such as previous wetlands and other landscape formations has been added to the history section.

City services and schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> These missing civic facilities are now listed in the community characteristics section and will be identified on Map 2.

Walking and wheeling safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The core value that speaks to mobility options has been modified to specify that pathways, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure need to be comfortable in addition to being safe, connected and accessible. It now reads: <i>Provide safe, comfortable, connected and accessible year-round mobility options including improved pathways, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure throughout the Plan area, particularly within Main Streets, Activity Centres and transit station areas.</i>



<p>Keeping some areas for single family homes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The core value that relates to high quality and diverse housing types has been changed by deleting the words “in all communities” and replacing with “throughout the Plan area”. It now states: <p><i>Support the development of high quality and diverse housing types throughout the Plan area to meet equitable socio-economic and demographic needs close to key services and amenities.</i></p>
<p>Road and infrastructure improvements to ease traffic related issues</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The core value that speaks to mobility options has been modified to specify that pathways, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure need to be comfortable in addition to being safe, connected and accessible. It now reads: <p><i>Provide safe, comfortable, connected and accessible year-round mobility options including improved pathways, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure throughout the Plan area, particularly within Main Streets, Activity Centres and transit station areas.</i></p>
<p>Shopping and dining options within walking distance</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The core value that speaks to mobility options has been modified to specify that pathways, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure need to be comfortable in addition to being safe, connected and accessible. It now reads: <p><i>Provide safe, comfortable, connected and accessible year-round mobility options including improved pathways, cycling and pedestrian infrastructure throughout the Plan area, particularly within Main Streets, Activity Centres and transit station areas.</i></p>
<p>Protecting and investing in the natural environment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two of the core values identify the importance of protecting and investing in the natural environment. Specific policies within Chapter 2 will expand upon these core values. The core value relating to climate change has been modified to read: <p><i>Reduce emissions of greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change and reduce vulnerability to climate-related hazards such as extreme heat or cold and drought or localized flooding to protect residents of the future.</i></p>
<p>Reducing crime</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Additional wording has been added to the core value relating to community identity to highlight the importance of “safe and inclusive communities”. The core value now indicates: <p><i>Achieve a strong sense of community identity in safe and inclusive communities by building upon the unique</i></p>
