- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 11 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 12 Chapter 470 of the Acts of 2018

- 13 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 14 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 8 years and 3 months and, at the end of
- 15 September 30, [2022] **2027**, this Act, with no further action required by the General
- 16 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in the annual report the State
- 18 Board of Physicians is required to submit under § 14–205.1 of the Health Occupations
- 19 Article, on or before October 1, 2023, the Board shall include an update on the status of the
- 20 Interstate Medical Licensure Compact under Subtitle 3A of the Health Occupations Article,
- 21 including:
- 22 (1) the number of Maryland licensees who have applied for licensure
- 23 through the Compact;

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- 1 (2) the number of Maryland licensees who have been approved for licensure 2 through the Compact;
- 3 (3) the member states participating in the Compact; and
- 4 (4) recommendations on whether Maryland should continue its 5 participation in the Compact and whether any statutory changes are needed to accomplish 6 the goal of streamlining licensure for out–of–state physicians.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  $8\,\,$  1, 2022.
