Tornadic Activity in Multiple States (Region VI & VII)

Situation: (NWC Advisory as of 10:20 p.m. ET, Apr 26)

Overnight the Storm Prediction Center identified 78 potential possible tornados from north central Texas to eastern Nebraska and Iowa. Region VII has reported numerous homes severely damaged or destroyed. Areas with reported damage include Elkhorn (pop. 6k), Lincoln (pop. 293k), and Omaha, NE (pop. 486k), Minden, IA (pop. 600) and Des Moines, IA (pop. 214k) metro area. NWS teams are conducting Preliminary Damage Surveys. There have been no reported requests for FEMA assistance. Moderate Risk of severe thunderstorms has been issued due to threat for strong tornadoes. There is potential for a tornado outbreak today from North Texas into Oklahoma, southeast Kansas and far southwest Missouri. Tornado watches are in effect until 2:00 p.m. ET.





- Numerous homes and businesses reported as heavily damaged or destroyed
- A building northeast of the state capital of Lincoln, Nebraska collapsed with 70 people inside (All parties evacuated safely. Three injuries reported)
- 1 confirmed injury in Jasper County, IA

Food, Hydration and Shelter:

- Shelters: (ARC as of 12:01 a.m. ET)
 NE: 2 congregate open (Elkhorn and Blair) / 0 occupants
- Energy: (EAGLE-I as of 7:30 a.m. ET, Apr 27)
- 41k (0.1%) customers without power across FEMA Region VI and VII
- FEMA Region VI : 32k (0.2%) customers without power
 - TX: 29k (0.2%) customers without power Camp County: 4k (66%) customers without power, Franklin: 2.5k (45%) customers without power, Titus: 7k (42%) customers without power
- FEMA Region VII: 32k (0.2%) customers without power
 - MO: 2k (0.1%) customers without power statewide
 - NE: 4k (0.1%) customers without power statewide
- NE 4 transmission lines confirmed down and another 6 lines with considerable damage; crews are actively working






National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Hazards Outlook – Apr 29–May 3
