Severe Weather – Southern Plains to Lower MS Valley

<u>Current Situation:</u> Severe weather moved through the Southern Plains overnight; preliminary reports of 22 (21 in TX, 1 in OK) tornadoes, 49 wind, and 25 hail reports. The severe weather threat is expected to move through the Lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast today, into southern and eastern Louisiana and southern and central Mississippi. Tornado Watch in effect for portions of TX, LA, and AR through 9:00 a.m. ET.

Lifeline Impacts:

- Safety and Security: Homes, businesses, and other structures damaged in TX and OK
- Food, Water, Shelter: 3 shelters in TX and OK, with unknown 0 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:49 a.m. ET)
- Health and Medical: Unknown number of injuries, 1 unconfirmed fatality (open-source media)
- Energy: TX 52k (0.42%, peak 76k; Bastrop 18%, Montague 11%, Williamson 1.9%); OK 8.6k (0.45%, peak 14k; Marshall 78%) (DOE Eagle-I as of 6:45 a.m. ET)

State / Local Response:

- TX EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19, extreme wildfire threat, severe weather)
- OK EOC at Normal Operations
- LA EOC at Normal Operations
- MS EOC at Partial Activation (severe weather threat)
- AL EOC at Normal Operations, may activate later

FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region VI at Enhanced Watch, 7:00 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. ET
- Region IV RWC continues to monitor; Enhanced Watch rostered
- NWC continues to monitor
- No requests for FEMA assistance






















National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook


